Digital Media Careers week. Global Triathlon Network (GTN) visit

The purpose of this visit was to explore media related careers and talk about skills and qualification required to gain an employment in this sector.

Our students were briefed about what it is like to work as a videographer and editor and what this job could possibly involve. Our visitor shared his experiences of working for GTN as both; an editor and a videographer and demonstrated some of the equipment he uses to record Sport events.

Students had an opportunity to ask questions and gain more insight into working in media.
